

TEACHER TO TEACHER RESOURCE: BIG BOOKS

- 1. Place the book where all students can see it well.
- 2. Use a pointer to track the words as you read aloud.
- 3. Encourage the students to join in when they want to.
- 4. Notice what the students can do and what is more difficult.
- 5. Students discuss their reactions to the book.
- 6. Re-read the book over several days.
- 7. Explain aspects of the text the children find difficult.
- 8. After teaching an aspect of the text, return to the book context.

Aspects of text which may be highlighted as needed:

Sound-letter relationships

Punctuation

Compare/contrast student speech patterns with standardized English

Word parts (endings, compound words)

Figurative language
