

TEACHER TO TEACHER RESOURCE: INTEREST GROUPS

- 1. Brainstorm topics of interest around a central theme
- 2. Discuss each topic, including how to find information
- 3. Students choose a topic from the brainstormed ideas
- 4. Students who chose the same topic form a group
- 5. Groups find and share information about their topic
- 6. Groups and/or individual students create a project for their topic
